This conflict for control over Cory's future arises from the ~~past experiences~~ experiences that Troy endured as a child and helps to reveal the importance ^{of the central idea that} changing the past in order to create helps to create a more successful future. Instead of continuing the abusive cycle that was thrust upon him, Troy chose to change the way he raised his own son in order to grant him a life more fulfilled than his own, showing that Troy is in fact hopeful.

As the play progresses, the audience slowly begins to witness Cory ~~metamorphasize~~ transform ~~into a~~ ~~from a~~ into a more outspoken person, especially toward his father Troy. Initially, Cory does what his father desires, whether it's chopping wood in the yard or going to run errands. ~~He~~ He mainly acts out of fear and intimidation for his father, and he primarily desires for his father to simply love him and be proud of him. However, as Troy becomes ~~more and more~~ increasingly controlling of Cory's future and activities, Cory becomes more and more outspoken, refusing to allow his father to control his life. This conflict creates a difficult situation between Cory and Troy that

never truly gets resolved. This conflict arises from Cory's determination to ~~be~~ ~~become~~ turn out more successful than his father did and break their impoverished cycle. This helps to contribute to the overall theme of Fences in that Cory is trying to change the path that Troy is attempting to set him on, revealing that the pursuit of one's dreams often involves changing the pattern of the past. While Cory is initially fearful of his father, he eventually becomes defiant and unyielding to his father's ~~force~~ demands, which is extremely evident when the two struggle ~~in~~ in an altercation that results in Cory being kicked out of the house.
