 - (2) **evaluation** of source assessing the effectiveness for purpose, the development of main idea [citing the most and/or least convincing evidence], and the use of rhetorical devices and strategies,
 - (3) **reflection** about source with discussion of how the source has affected, shaped, or changed your thinking about the essential question.
