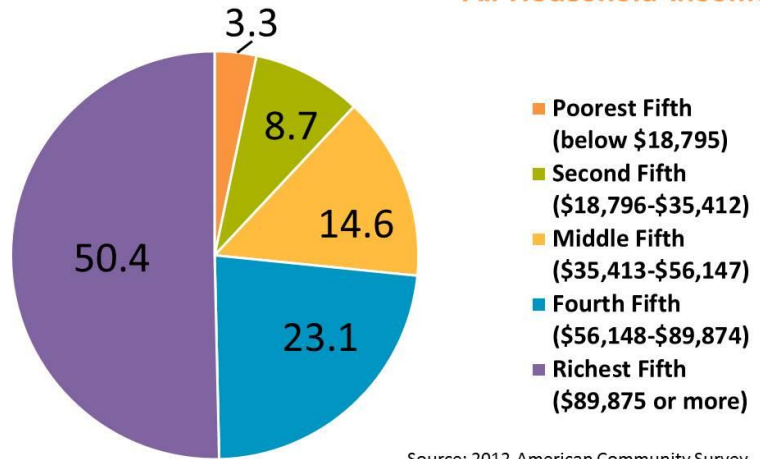
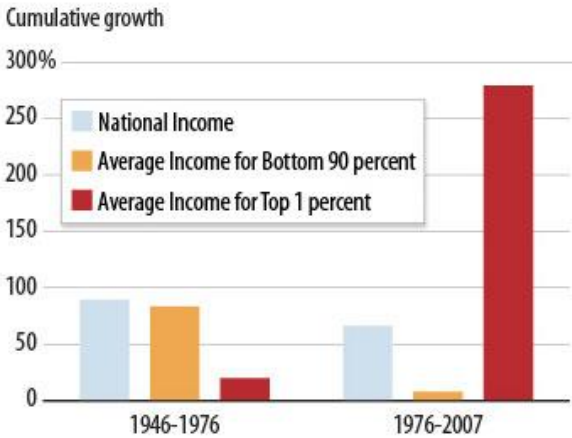

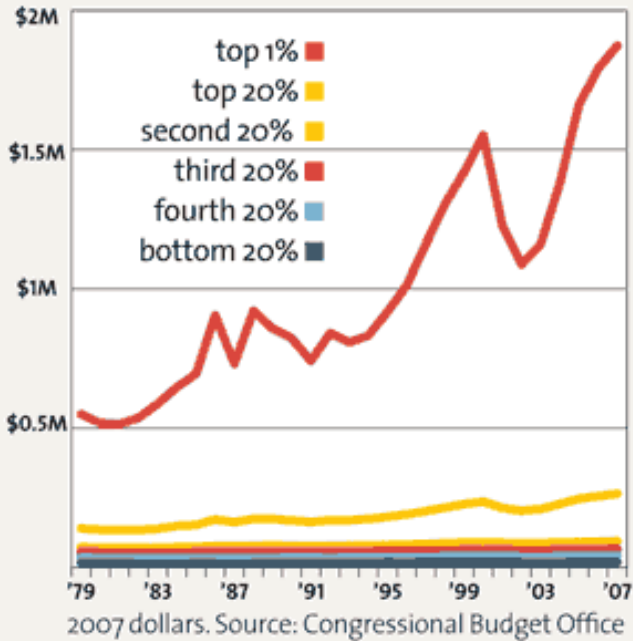
The Richest Earners Hold the Biggest Piece of the Pie, or More than Half of All Household Income



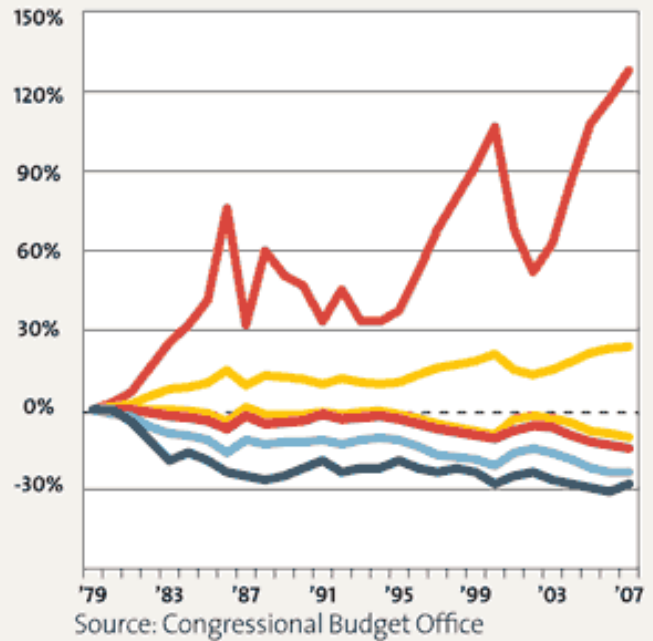

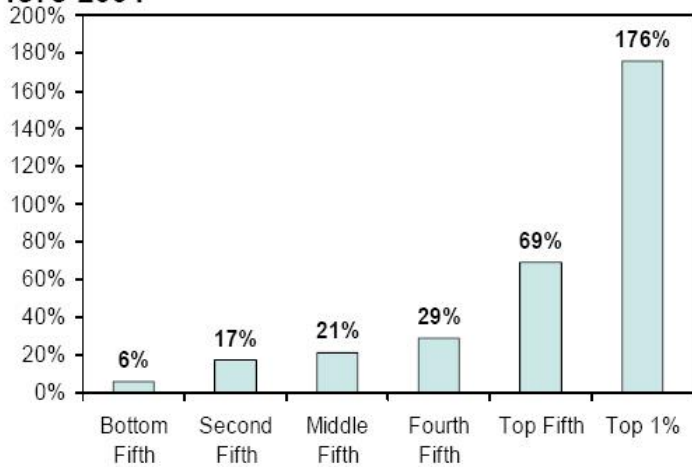
AVERAGE HOUSEHOLD INCOME before taxes

Change in Average Real After-Tax Income: 1979-2004

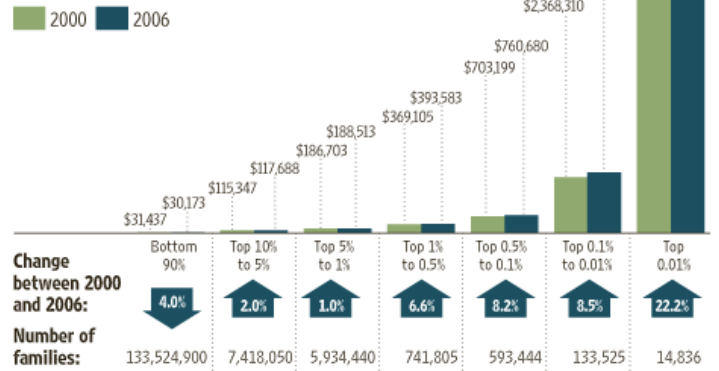

Average family income, excluding capital gains, adjusted for inflation:

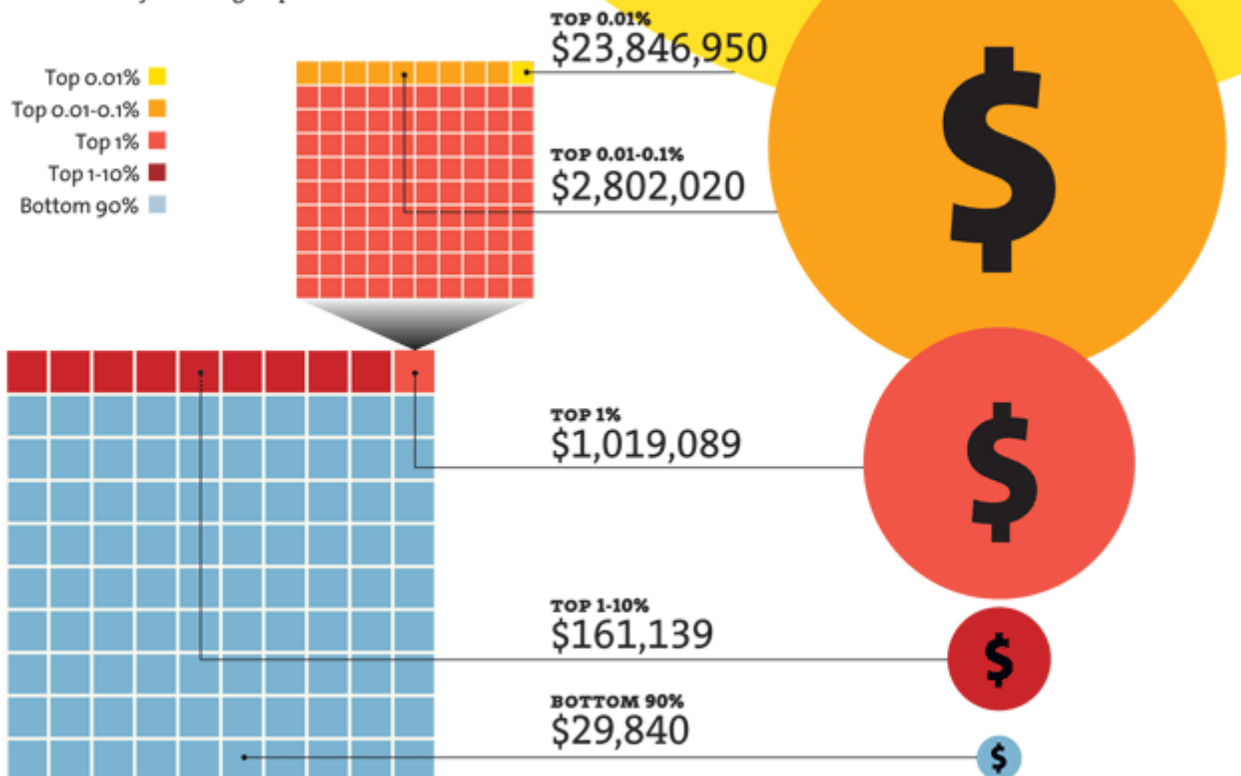

AVERAGE INCOME PER FAMILY

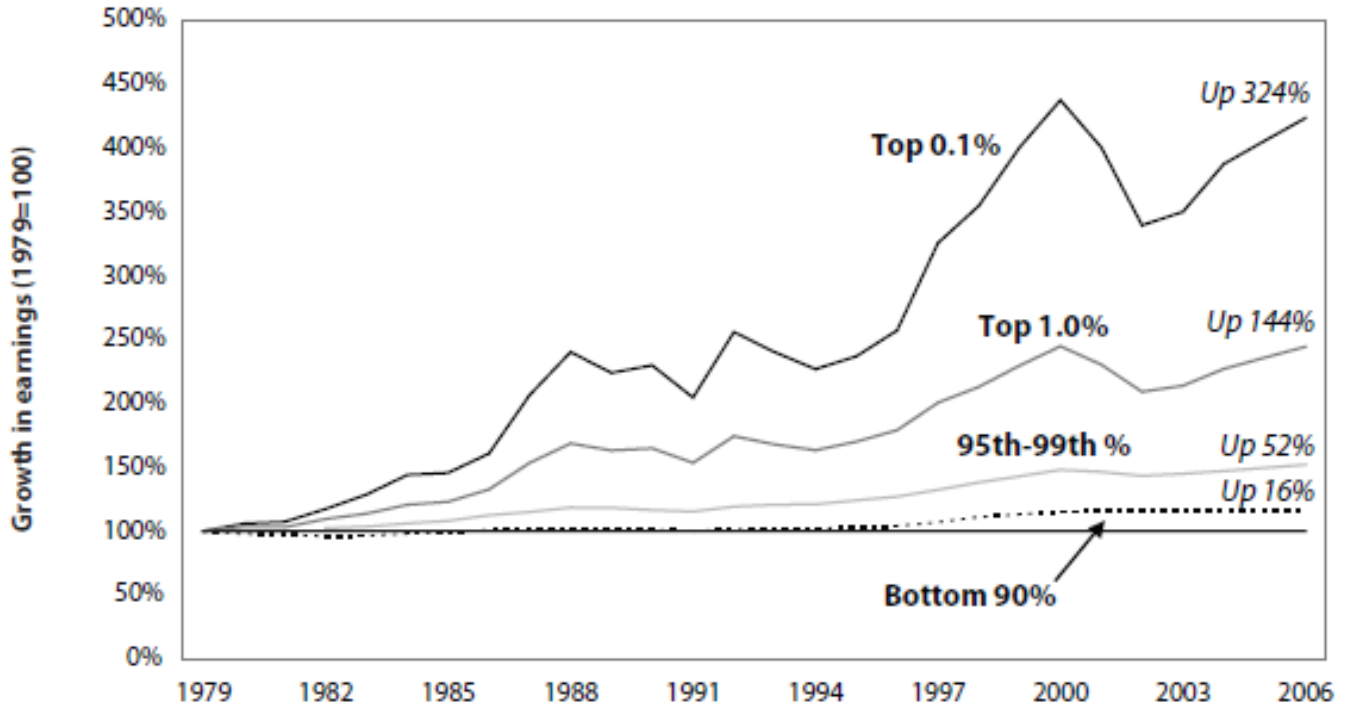

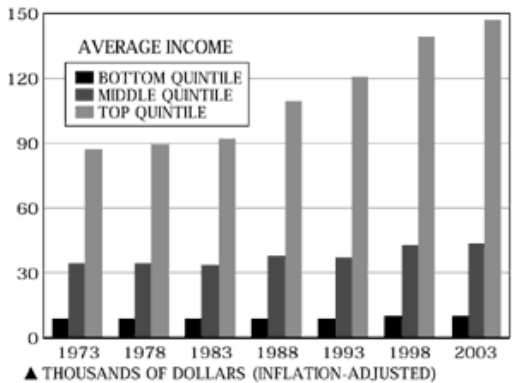

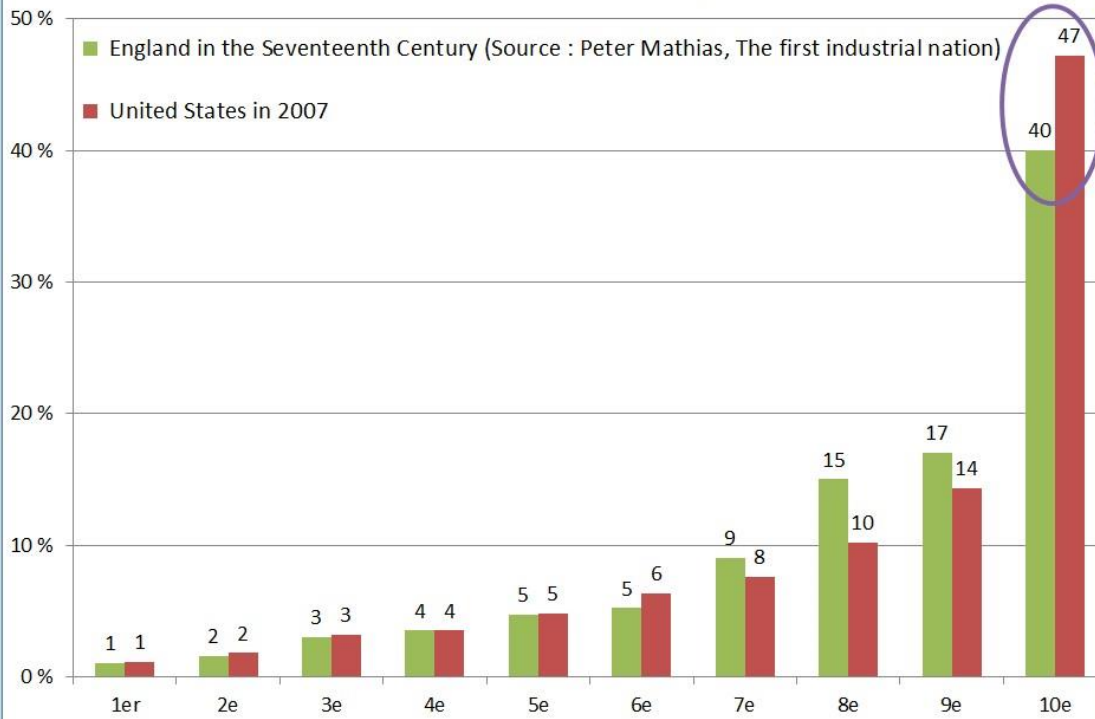

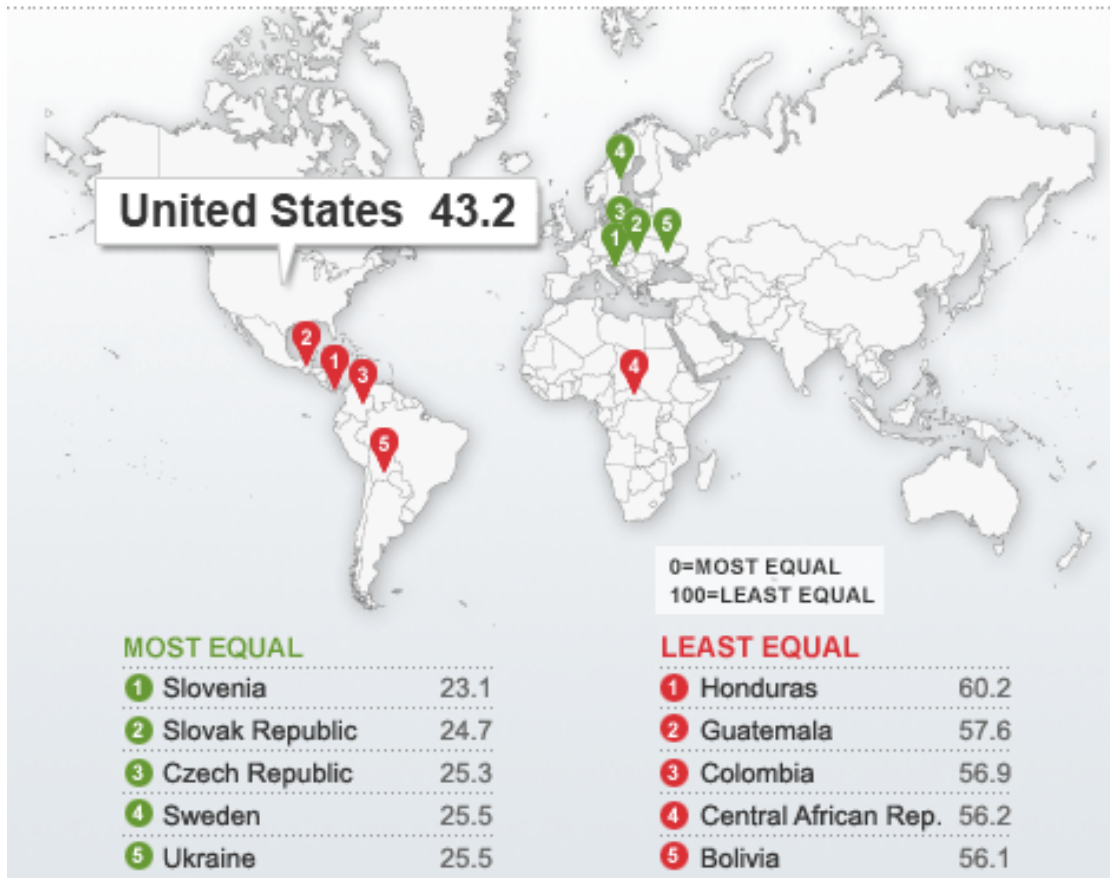
