- 1. In "Search for Mr. Hyde," Utterson experiences "a night of little ease to his toiling mind" (7). Contemplate the title of chapter 3, and <u>contrast</u> Utterson's and Jekyll's states of mind, providing textual evidence.
- 2. How does the <u>characterization</u> of Utterson in paragraph 1 illustrate his consistency?
- 3. What does Jekyll's reaction to the concerns of his two oldest friends suggest about him?
- 4. What prompts a change in Jekyll's demeanor? Identify details that suggest Jekyll is experiencing <u>internal</u> <u>conflict</u>.
- 5. How does the ending of chapter 3 parallel the ending of chapter 1? What do Utterson's verbal and physical responses suggest?
- 6. Identify connections to 19<sup>th</sup> century ideologies (-ism).
