- 1. Examine the <u>setting</u> established at the beginning of this chapter. What do the details about Jekyll's laboratory suggest (especially about connections with setting elements in other chapters)?
- 2. How is Jekyll <u>characterized</u> in this chapter, in comparison to the depiction of him in "Dr. Jekyll Was Quite at Ease"? (Look particularly for parallel statements within these two chapters.) What has changed and why?
- 3. In what ways does the <u>indirect characterization</u> of Utterson (through his words and actions) reinforce the <u>direct</u> <u>characterization</u> in the first paragraph of the novella?
- 4. How do <u>minor characters</u> Poole and Guest pay pivotal roles in the novella's <u>plot</u> development?
- 5. What motifs (door, key, documents) reappear in this chapter and why?
- 6. Identify connections to 19<sup>th</sup> century ideologies (-ism).
