- 1. Identify the <u>parallels</u> between this chapter and "Story of the Door" (setting, characters, dialogue).
- 2. Examine the <u>setting</u> of courtyard. What is significant about the details and the juxtaposition?
- 3. This is the shortest chapter in the novella. How does it serve as a <u>transition</u> in the <u>plot</u>?
- 4. Examine how Jekyll is <u>characterized</u> in this chapter. In what ways has he and does he change?
- 5. In what ways does the <u>indirect characterization</u> of Utterson (through his words and actions) reinforce the <u>direct</u> <u>characterization</u> in the first paragraph of the novella?
- 6. At the end of the chpater, Utterson says, "God forgive us!" twice. Why? How does this exclamation suggest this is the climax of the novella?
- 7. Identify connections to 19th century ideologies (-ism).
