"Dr. Lanyon's Narrative" analysis questions

- 1. How does this chapter mark a change in the <u>narrative</u> <u>point of view</u> in the novella?
- 2. Once again, Stevenson uses the narrative device of a story within a story in this chapter. Examine Henry Jekyll's letter and analyze the <u>rhetorical strategies and devices</u> he uses to persuade Lanyon.
- 3. How is Lanyon <u>characterized</u> in this chapter? Pay particular attention to his duality as scientist and gentleman.
- 4. The second half of the chapter is dominated by <u>diction</u> of change and mystery. Identify language Lanyon uses and what he is describing or explaining.
- 5. Hyde gives Lanyon a choice of maintaining ignorance or gaining knowledge. How does his choice affect him? And, how does this choice reveal larger thematic issues?
- 6. Identify connections to 19th century ideologies (-ism).
